!!!Please note the following change: The covid 19 vaccination must be completed in addition to the other routinely required vaccinations. So your medical can only be completed and submitted AFTER you have been fully vaccinated against Covid-19.

If possible make an appointment with us after complete vaccination. Generally, you can also make a medical appointment with us before the complete Covid-19 vaccination. However, we can only forward the medical to the US authorities after we have received your complete vaccination documents. The process is then on hold until we receive your complete vaccination documents! Please keep in mind: The maximum validity of your medical of 6 months after the appointment.

Please book your appointment by using [Doctolib](#) and fill out all required forms in advance (see button on the right-hand side of this page)!

Important notice: For Applicants from Countries with high risk for Poliomyelitis (e. g. [Afghanistan](#), [Pakistan](#), and [Ukraine](#)) a Vaccination for Poliomyelitis is required within the past 12 months.

United States Immigrant Visa applicants need to bring to their appointment:

- A current travelling passport
- Proof of vaccination history if available
- For K1-visa and Diversity applicants you need to bring 4 passport-photos
- Medical reports and/or prescribed medication (when suffering from a serious disease)
- Paperwork from the U.S. Consulate with Case Number if available (**DS-260 od DS-160 confirmation page**)

United States Non-Immigrant Visa applicants need to bring to their appointment:

- A current travelling passport
- For DUI, K1 and Diversity visa 4 identical passport size photos which are less than 3 months old.
- Paperwork from the U.S. Consulate
- Conviction history from Ministry of Justice, if relevant
- Vaccination record, if available

Medical examination consists of three parts:

- Physical examination
- Chest x-ray (not required for applicants younger than 15 years)
- Non-fasting blood test (not required for applicants younger than 15 years)
- Urine test (not required for applicants younger than 15 years)

A chest x-ray is required for all pregnant US Immigrant Visa applicants, without exception. You can defer your medical until after the end of your pregnancy, if you do not wish to have the x-ray. There is no waiver available for pregnant women! Please allow 2-3 hours for physical examination, chest x-ray and blood test.
